## Annual Association Meeting

The Middlesex County Association and London Diocesan Guild will hold its Annual General Meeting on Saturday 22nd April and this year it is hosted by the North and East District.
The day begins with the Inter-District Striking Competition, with two teams selected by the District Ringing Masters and a touch set by Steve Mitchell. This will be held at St Mary's, Upper Street and the judges will report the results at the AGM later in the day with the winners taking home the Roger Bailey cup. The inaugural competition for the cup was held in 2014 and was won by the first S\&W band by a large margin, but the cup was awarded to the runner-up because a wrong call had caused S\&W's band to 'cross'; better luck to all this time.
All members are invited to join the main events of the day at St Mary Magdelene, Holloway Road. We start with general ringing from 11:30, then a service and lunch before the meeting and we will finish with more general ringing to be finished by 4.30 . This is an earlier timing than usual because Arsenal are playing at 3pm so the Holloway Road will be busier than usual from around 12:30 until 3 and again from 5 until 6 -ish. Our timing means people miss the rushes.
It's 125 years since the foundation of the Middlesex County Association and we shall celebrate with called changes to $\mathbf{1 2 5 7 3 4 6 8}$, touches of 125 changes of Grandsire Triples and of Middlesex Bob Triples.

Did you know that the Middlesex Association has a Facebook group, a Facebook page and a Twitter account? Are you active on Instagram, YouTube or TikTok? Some towers have set up a ringers' website linked (with the incumbent's permission) to the website of the church. This enables the band to display video clips, reports of ringing and recruitment information of their choice.
Bellringing is a relatively hidden activity, so many people will hear bells without knowing exactly where they come from and often without realising that people are ringing the bells 'live'.
Part of recruitment comes from raising awareness, making it easier for people to know that bellringing is available for them to learn, something which could become a valued social and mental actvity

## Master on BBC 4

On December 20th the music writer Laura Barton presented a programme on bells and change-ringing. Laura visited All Hallows in Twickenham where Stephen Mitchell and his bellringers demonstrated what's possible with a peal of ten bells. She even had a go. Change-ringing feels at one, according to the poet John Betjeman and the musician Virginia Astley, with Britain's landscape. Laura related the timbre of the bells to the music of Jonathan Harvey whose Mortuos Plango Vivos Voco is drawn from samples of his son's treble voice and the largest bell at Winchester Cathedral.

## London Bell Ringers' Advent Carol Service

At 7.30pm on Tuesday 29 November 2022 ringers from across London and Surrey met at the newly refurbished St John's Waterloo for the annual Advent Carol Service. I say annual but the last time we met in-person was in late 2019! This fine church badly damaged in the last war, rebuilt in the 1950s, has recently benefited from a $£ 5.5 \mathrm{~m}$ update. Trisha Shannon (Docklands Ringing Centre Secretary) arranged for the church to host the service.

Edmund Wratten, the tower captain, managed the general ringing on the ring of eight before and after the service ringing. The last touch before the service and the first touch afterwards were from the Society of Royal Cumberland Youths, courtesy of Bridget


Campbell (Middlesex S\&W District Secretary). The London Ringers' Choir, a scratch choir of singer ringers, came together to sing carols chosen, arranged and conducted by Professor Greg Rose who used to ring regularly at Stepney.

The organ was expertly played by ringing learner Norman Harper. The choir had two rehearsals the week before and then one an hour or so before the service. The on-the-day practice was punctuated by the general ringing; the organist, being quite close to the ringing room, could barely hear the choir! It gave a whole new meaning to the words of the final hymn 'Sleepers awake': Let men and angels join in chorus (i.e. the choir), Let harp and cymbal add their sound (i.e. the bells)!

The service began promptly - with the preservice ringing stopping bang on time - and was led by The Reverend Canon Giles Goddard, vicar of St John's. The post-service ringing started as soon as the closing organ voluntary had finished - again, beautifully timed!
The six readings were read by representatives of the Essex Association of Change Ringers, the Ladies Guild of Change Ringers, the London University Society of Change Ringers, the Middlesex County \& London Diocesan Guild of Church Bell Ringers, the Guildford Diocesan Guild of Church Bell Ringers and the Docklands Ringers. So quite a spread, representing both sides of the river.
It was a lovely service which zipped along nicely with no hold-ups - and no sermon! Afterwards we adjourned to the Duke of Sussex pub nearby and a very small private function room for celebratory drinks.

## Ringing for the Coronation

At a planning meeting in December 2022, the Tower Talk team discussed inviting ringers to compose a sequence of ringing, or a set of call changes, that could be rung for the coronation by those at an early stage in their ringing career. Here's a couple of suggestions:

## Wendy Crampton

I'm sure that a very splendid and complicated 12 Bell method is being created to celebrate the King's coronation. But folk who have not yet mastered methods, or who aren't able to join in a Quarter Peal attempt, need something simpler. The routine below, combining foundation skills from the first three levels of the ART novice change ringer LtR scheme, aims to build confidence in new ringers and support their growth; and more importantly to ensure they are included and valued members of their band.
"Ringing for the King" attracts new ringers, see https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-england-suffolk-64718027 but even with excellent teaching, a novice may be able to ring only this kind of routine. Being able to pull off in well struck rounds before moving on to reverse rounds is a starting point. All of the components below require a focus on bell control and accurate striking.
If a novice is able to ring such a routine competently so that it sounds rhythmical, it can be a very motivating achievement, and an encouragement to progress further.


## Sonia Field

The row 321546 sounds rather good but doesn't (yet) have a specific name. Call it by:
Call 4 to 5, and 2 to 3 (as in Queens) 132546
Call 1 to 3 , then 1 to 2 ,
321546
Call 3 to 2 , then 3 to 1
213546
Call 5 to 4 , then 3 to 4
214356
Finally move the tenor.
Call 5 over 6 giving
214365
Return to rounds by crossing the pairs.
